NEW USPS RULES REGARDING POSTMARKS

If you are mailing a rendition, exemption or special-use application, protest form, or any other time sensitive document, please be aware of the rule change to the USPS postmark date.

USPS's postmark date no longer reflects when your mail is dropped off to the post office. The postmark date now indicates when your mail is first processed by automated machines.

The Texas Property Tax Code still requires time sensitive documents to be postmarked by the deadline date. To ensure timely filing of your document, please mail it several days prior to the deadline date or ***get a hand-stamped postmark at the USPS counter for official dating.*** As an alternate, you may file many forms using our online system, <https://forms.jcad.org>, or <https://portal.jcad.org> for protests.

The District will not extend any filing deadlines due to USPS's new postmark rules.
